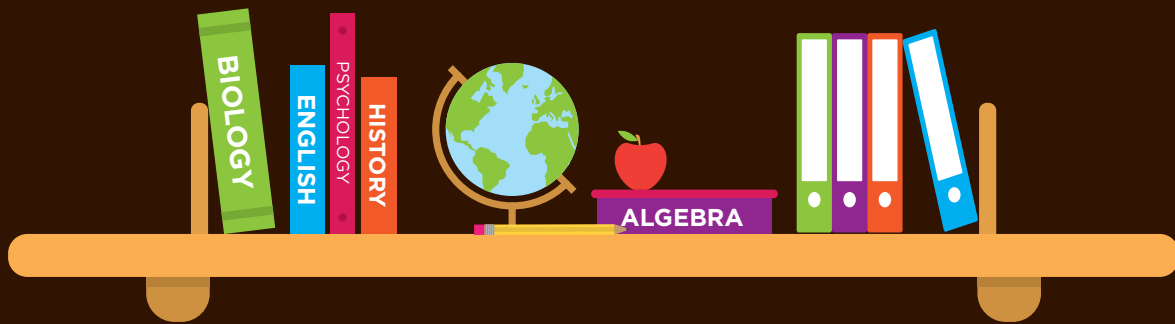


THE FLORIDA PRE K-12 EDUCATION LANDSCAPE



1.6 MILLION STUDENTS CHOOSE

School choice is now mainstream. Of Florida's 3.4 million PreK-12 students, 47 percent attended a school of their choice during the 2017-18 school year.

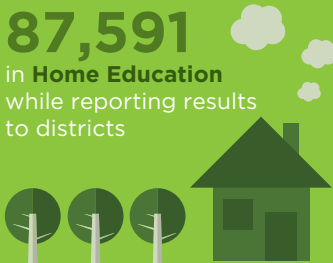
